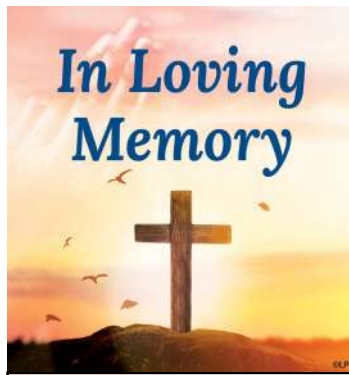

OF SCRIPTURE****January 1, 2023****Mary, The Holy Mother of God**

We hide ourselves and our secrets from God because we are afraid. Even Mary can seem too perfect to approach. The shepherds find the strength to speak to Mary and Joseph at the moment they see the child in the manger. They open their hearts and share what they've experienced. Saint Luke writes of the shepherds, "When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child."

When I was a college student, I visited Rome. Beggars often approached and said, "Mangia? Mangia?" I didn't speak Italian and thought, "Why are they speaking about the Christmas nativity scene?" My friend said, "Mangia means eat. They're hungry." That's when I realized more deeply than ever before that Mary puts her baby in a place designed for hungry animals to eat.

See that baby in the manger in your heart. Imagine Mary kneeling nearby looking at you with love. She doesn't cling to God for herself. In that cave, from the beginning, she quietly offers her son to hungry souls. The manger means vulnerable self-offering love. That's the sign. This week that same manger opens our hearts to tell Mary about our lives, too.

DE LAS ESCRITURAS****1 de enero de 2023****María, la Santa Madre de Dios**

Nos escondemos a nosotros mismos y a nuestros secretos de Dios porque tenemos miedo. Incluso Mary puede parecer demasiado perfecta para acercarse. Los pastores encuentran la fuerza para hablar con María y José en el momento en que ven al niño en el pesebre. Abren sus corazones y comparten lo que han experimentado. San Lucas escribe de los pastores: "Al ver esto, dieron a conocer el mensaje que les había sido dicho acerca de este niño".

Cuando era estudiante universitario, visité Roma. Los mendigos a menudo se acercaban y decían: "¿Mangia? ¿Mangia? No hablaba italiano y pensé: "¿Por qué están hablando del pesebre de Navidad?". Mi amigo dijo: "Mangia significa comer. Ellos tienen hambre." Fue entonces cuando me di cuenta más profundamente que nunca de que Mary pone a su bebé en un lugar diseñado para que coman animales hambrientos.

Mira a ese bebé en el pesebre en tu corazón. Imagina a María arrodillada cerca de ti mirándote con amor. Ella no se aferra a Dios por sí misma. En esa cueva, desde el principio, en silencio ofrece a su hijo a las almas hambrientas. El pesebre significa amor vulnerable que se ofrece a sí mismo. Esa es la señal. Esta semana ese mismo pesebre nos abre el corazón para contarle a María también nuestra vida.

**History of the Rosary
Question:**

What is the history of the rosary? Where did this prayer come from?

Answer:

Although a longstanding tradition attributed the rosary to Saint Dominic and the Dominican Order, the practice of using beads to count prayers predates the Dominicans by a few hundred years. In fact, it seems that what we now think of as the rosary (which means "garland of roses") was first developed by illiterate peasants and religious brothers and sisters as a way of offering 150 "Our Fathers" to replace the praying of the 150 psalms in the Divine Office.

The practice of reciting 150 Hail Marys (which was later subdivided into 15 decades of 10 Hail Marys) arose during the late Middle Ages. Devotion to the rosary began to flourish in the nineteenth century, especially as new devotions to Mary began to spread throughout Europe and the New World. An annual liturgical celebration of Our Lady of the Rosary was introduced into the Church calendar in 1573 and it has been observed on the date of October 7 since 1913.

In the apostolic letter *On the Most Holy Rosary*, Pope Saint John Paul II not only added five new mysteries to the traditional fifteen, but he also reminded Catholics that the rosary is, at its core, an opportunity to go deeper into the life of Jesus: "The rosary, though clearly Marian in character, is at heart a Christocentric prayer ... It has all the depth of the Gospel message in its entirety, of which it can be said to be a compendium. It is an echo of Mary's prayer, her perennial Magnificat ... With the rosary, the Christian people sit at the school of Mary and are led to contemplate the beauty of the face of Christ and to experience the depths of his love"



**Historia del Rosario
Pregunta:**

¿Cuál es la historia del rosario? ¿De dónde salió esta oración?

Responder:

Aunque una larga tradición atribuye el rosario a Santo Domingo y la Orden Dominicana, la práctica de usar cuentas para contar las oraciones es anterior a los dominicanos por unos pocos cientos de años. De hecho, parece que lo que ahora consideramos el rosario (que significa "guirnalda de rosas") fue desarrollado por primera vez por campesinos analfabetos y hermanos y hermanas religiosos como una forma de ofrecer 150 "Padres Nuestros" para reemplazar el rezo del 150 salmos en el Oficio Divino.

La práctica de recitar 150 Avemarías (que luego se subdividió en 15 décadas de 10 Avemarías) surgió durante la Baja Edad Media. La devoción al rosario comenzó a florecer en el siglo XIX, especialmente cuando nuevas devociones a María comenzaron a extenderse por toda Europa y el Nuevo Mundo. Una celebración litúrgica anual de Nuestra Señora del Rosario se introdujo en el calendario de la Iglesia en 1573 y se observa en la fecha del 7 de octubre desde 1913.

En la carta apostólica *Sobre el Santísimo Rosario*, el Papa San Juan Pablo II no solo agregó cinco nuevos misterios a los quince tradicionales, sino que también recordó a los católicos que el rosario es, en esencia, una oportunidad para profundizar en la vida de Jesús. : "El rosario, aunque de carácter claramente mariano, es en el fondo una oración cristocéntrica... Tiene toda la profundidad del mensaje evangélico en su totalidad, del que se puede decir que es un compendio. Es un eco de la oración de María, su perenne Magnificat... Con el rosario, el pueblo cristiano se sienta en la escuela de María y es llevado a contemplar la belleza del rostro de Cristo y a experimentar la profundidad de su amor".

Archbishop William E. Lori:

"This month, I challenge you to give witness to your faith and love by supporting the pro-life cause in some concrete way, such as by donating your time or other resources. Second, I challenge you to participate in the ASAP, Novena for Life, and/or March for Life programs."

"Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven."

(Gospel for Jan. 29, Mt 5:11-12a)

It often isn't popular to be a true follower of Jesus. That can especially be the case when we express our faith in public ways. For example, many Christians who have prayed outside an abortion facility have experienced hostility for their beliefs. But when we stand up courageously for truth and righteousness — even when we face opposition or persecution to do so — we know we do so as followers of Christ.

Questions for Reflection:

Are you willing to suffer as a disciple of Christ, as Jesus warned would happen? Do you sometimes fail to speak up for your faith or moral values out of a desire to be liked by others or to not "rock the boat"?

What concrete, practical things can you do to strengthen your willingness and ability to publicly witness to your faith, even when it might be unpopular — or come with a cost?
